about other artists; this collection concentrates on Kelley's own work, ranging from texts in "voices" that grew out of scripts for performance pieces to expository critical and autobiographical writings. *Minor Histories* organizes Kelley's writings into five sections. "Statements" consists of twenty pieces produced between 1984 and 2002 (most of which were written to accompany exhibitions), including "Ajax," which draws on Homer, Colgate- Palmolive, and Longinus to present its eponymous hero; "Some Aesthetic High Points," an exercise in autobiography that counters the standard artist bio included in catalogs and press releases; and a sequence of "creative writings" that use mass cultural tropes in concert with high art mannerisms—approximating in prose the visual styles that characterize Kelley's artwork. "Video Statements and Proposals" are introductions to videos made by Kelley and other artists, including Paul McCarthy and Bob Flanagan and Sheree Rose. "Image-Texts" offers writings that accompany or are part of artworks and installations. This section includes "A Stopgap Measure," Kelley's zestful millennial essay in social satire, and "Meet John Doe," a collage of appropriated texts. "Architecture" features an discussion of Kelley's Educational Complex (1995) and an interview in which he reflects on the role of architecture in his work. Finally, "Ufology" considers the aesthetics and sexuality of space as manifested by UFO sightings and abduction scenarios.

*Winona in Vintage Postcards* Oct 20 2021 Before its founding by white settlers, Winona, Minnesota, was the home of a band of Sioux led by the great Wapasha dynasty. After white settlement began in 1851, the city's growth was fueled by the Mississippi riverboat trade. Designing Detroit Jul 17 2021 In the early 1900s, Detroit was leading the nation in architectural innovation and designer Wirt Rowland was at the forefront of this advancement, yet few are even aware of his substantial contribution to the evolution of architectural style. It is widely believed that celebrated local architect Albert Kahn designed many of Detroit's structures, such as the General Motors and First National Bank buildings. In fact, while Kahn's efforts were focused on running his highly successful firm, it was Rowland, his chief designer, who was responsible for the appearance and layout of these buildings—an important point in appreciating the contributions of both Kahn and Rowland. During the early twentieth century, Rowland devised a wholly new or “modern” design for buildings, one not reliant on decorative elements copied from architecture of the past. As buildings became more specialized for their intended use, Rowland met the challenge with entirely new design

methodologies and a number of improved technologies and materials that subsequently became commonplace. *Designing Detroit: Wirt Rowland and the Rise of Modern American Architecture* begins with a brief overview of Rowland's early life and career. Author Michael G. Smith goes on to analyze Rowland's achievements in building design and as a leader of Detroit's architectural community throughout both World Wars and the Great Depression. The interdependence of architecture with the city's fluctuating economic prosperity and population growth is explored, illuminating the conditions for good architecture and the arts in general. The author identifies the influence of Jay Hambidge's "dynamic symmetry" in Rowland's work and how it allowed him to employ color as a modern replacement for traditional ornamentation, leading to the revolutionary design of the Union Trust (Guardian) Building, for which he receives nearly unanimous praise in national media. This book is concerned primarily with Rowland's influence on Detroit architecture, but spans beyond his work in Michigan to include the designer's broad reach from New York to Miami. A comprehensive appendix includes extensive lists of Rowland's publications, locations he had designed, and jobs taken on by his firm during his tenure. This book represents new research and insights not previously discussed in either scholarly or general audience texts and will be of interest to casual readers of Detroit history, as well as architecture historians.

Dieses Buch präsentiert die eindrucksvollsten Aufnahmen - planetarische Landschaftsfotografie vom Feinsten! - und begleitet sie mit den spannenden Erläuterungen von Jim Bell, dem leitenden Fotografen der Mission. Ein Text-Bild-Band aus erster Hand im großen Sonderformat. Ein "Wow!"-Buch für alle Astro- und Weltraum-Fans. Die Reise der beiden Roboterfahrzeuge Spirit und Opportunity zum Mars und ihre nun schon viele Jahre währende Kundschaftertätigkeit dort zählen zu den aufregendsten Unternehmungen des modernen Raumfahrtzeitalters. Ihre Landung mit einer verwirrenden Vielfalt wissenschaftlicher Instrumente und je einer einmaligen Stereo-Panoramakamera an Bord war der Höhepunkt von Jahren wissenschaftlicher und technologischer Entwicklungsarbeit. Die Ingenieure hatten erwartet, dass die Kameras auf ihren solarbetriebenen Rovern etwa drei Monate lang Bilder aufnehmen würden. Keiner wagte zu hoffen, dass diese unglaublichen Roboter nach vier Jahren immer noch die Ebenen und Berge des Mars erforschen würden. Bis heute haben sie über 200.000 Bilder nach Hause geschickt; einige benötigten mehrere Tage, bis sie uns durch den Weltraum über die riesige Distanz erreicht haben. Schon zu Beginn der Mission wurde Jim Bell die schwere Aufgabe übertragen, die Welt mit diesen historischen Ansichten zu versorgen. Jedes Farbbild, das vom Mars zur Erde kam, wanderte zuerst durch sein Notebook, bevor es verschickt oder gedruckt wurde. Jetzt hat er die Auswahl und Bearbeitung dieser Bilder - manche 20.000 Pixel breit - für das großformatige Jahrhundertbuch, das sie verdienen, fertiggestellt. Für die deutsche Ausgabe hat Jim Bell nicht nur ein neues Nachwort verfasst, sondern auch 5 spektakuläre neue Aufnahmen vom Mars aus den letzten Monaten (bis Juli 2007!) hinzugefügt. Vier der atemberaubendsten hyperrealistischen Panoramabildern sind auf großartigen, mehr als einen Meter breiten

ausklappbaren Seiten gedruckt. Doch auch Fotos von Mikroskopkameras sind in dem Band zu sehen: Sie zeigen Nahaufnahmen von fremdartigen und doch vertrauten Felsen und Böden, über die die Rover Spirit und Opportunity gerollt sind. Nie zuvor hat ein menschliches Werkzeug so tiefeschürfende Gedanken über unseren Platz im Universum in uns ausgelöst. Postkarten vom Mars ist ein Meisterstück sowohl der Kunst als auch der Wissenschaft. Zum ersten Mal, seit es Leben auf der Erde gibt, können wir erfahren, wie es ist, auf der Oberfläche eines anderen Planeten zu sein. Jim Bells Buch eröffnet uns dieses einmalige Fenster in Zeit und Raum. "An amazing picture book by the man in charge of the rover mission cameras on the planet's surface. Railroad Postcards of Yellowstone Jul 05 2020 The fastest way to travel long distances in the beginning of the 20th century was by railroad. Railroad companies competed to attract business and vacationing travellers by advertising in brochures and issuing postcards. The postcards included railroad logos and descriptions of Western adventures that travellers would experience by booking with a particular rail line. The Northern Pacific Railroad and Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul Railroad have provided some of the most captivating images of the unique Yellowstone National Park (YNP) hydrologic, geologic, and geothermal features. The Union Pacific Railroad built the full-scale Old Faithful Lodge at the Panama-Pacific International Exposition of 1915; the National Park Service data show the YNP attendance more than doubled in that year. Both the Union Pacific Railroad and Burlington Route provided high-quality postcards to promote their routes to visit YNP. The Burlington Route and Northern Pacific Railroad included American Indian-related postcards for diversity.

**Photography and Cyprus** Jan 23 2022 Formerly a British colony, the island of Cyprus is now a

divided country, where histories of political and cultural conflicts, as well as competing identities, are still contested. Cyprus provides the ideal case study for this innovative exploration, extensively illustrated, of how the practice of photography in relation to its political, cultural and economic contexts both contributes and responds to the formation of identity. Contributors from Cyprus, Greece, the UK and the USA, representing diverse disciplines, draw from photography theory, art history, anthropology and sociology to explore how the island and its people have been represented photographically. They reveal how the different gazes- colonial, political, gendered, and within art photography- contribute to the creation of individual and national identities and, by extension, to the creation and re-creation of imagery of Cyprus as place. While *Photography and Cyprus* focuses on one geographical and cultural territory, the questions this book asks and the themes and arguments it follows apply also to other places characterized by their colonial heritage. The intriguing example of Cyprus thus serves as a fitting test-ground for current debates relating to photography, place and identity.
